The Tesla vision is to accelerate the world's transition to sustainable energy. They make sedans and SUV's, and now a big pickup truck, the Cybertruck. I took the three photos on this page on October 15, 2024, at the Tesla service center in League City near NASA/JSC.

When we bought our 2024 Tesla Model Y SUV on June 24, this service center parking lot was only half full, though it is usually packed full. On October 15, 2024, it was packed full again. About 50 Cybertrucks were on the parking lot. Two long rows of them were very visible from the northbound Gulf Freeway.

With our five-year loan at about 1%, the monthly payments are steep, but since we will pay the 2024 IRS tax return with more than \$7500, we got \$7500 off at the time of purchase.


The Tesla Cybertucks have not been perfect, but several features seem to be state of the art. They use steel similar to the steel of the SpaceX Starship spacecraft, bulletproof to subsonic bullets from handguns, in case of the Zombie Apocalypse. Built Tesla Tough.

They use 45 V instead of 12 V, and I recall the good effects of going from 6 V to 12 V around 1966. They use steer-bywire. Steering column stalks are removed, and those functions use buttons on the steering wheel or maybe a yoke steering wheel.

They use four-wheel steering. The back wheels turn together up to ten degrees to help in U-turns and high speed lane changes. Ground clearance is adjustable up to 17 inches.

Almost all Lee High School yearbooks (82 of them) are public and online using this Flickr link. Flickr is "free" social media for photos and captions. Classmates dot com is "free" social media for high school yearbooks. They have 77 of these yearbooks (available publically). The Latin Club "slave" (enslaved persons) sales were often big articles in these yearbooks from about 1945 to 1955. Around the USA, this continues in 2012 and 2024. Usually it is the Latin Club. Once it was a school event for the prom, the raising money with the sale of "enslaved" people who were then humiliated: students, staff, and administrators. The school board voted 4-3 in 2020 to keep the name Robert E. Lee High School. The three were "local."

The 1964 North Charleston South Carolina High School yearbook includes two of my three older brothers, Rick and Dennis Yazell, on the Classmates website. The Charleston Rubber Company bought an advertisement (page 154), and they quoted Edith Hamilton, 1867-1963. She was famous for books about themes like those of the Latin clubs.

Page 74 of that yearbook shows two female students in the roles of enslaved ancient Romans or Greeks being sold while chained.

Hamilton's books are described in her Wikipedia article. A 2023 Edith Hamilton article by Emily Wilson in The Nation (paywall after about four articles) describes Hamilton well, and it also describes the right-wing and elitist history of this fad in the USA for studying Latin, ancient Greece, and ancient Rome.

Our student population comes from the cities of Baytown and Highlands, with an enrollment of approximately 1,676 for 2010-2011. Distinctions Earned: Math, Student Progress

Over the years, our school has undergone numerous renovations, including the reconstruction of the main building following a devastating fire in 1987 and a new Art & Science building. These renovations have allowed us to offer a state-of-the-art learning facility while preserving the beauty of this historical landmark. 



Hurricane John was a powerful tropical cyclone that caused deadly flooding across southern Mexico for several days in September 2024. The eleventh named storm, fourth hurricane, and second major hurricane of the 2024 Pacific hurricane season, John originated from a low-pressure area offshore Southern Mexico. This low developed into Tropical Depression Ten-E on the afternoon of September 22, strengthening into Tropical Storm John the following morning. Undergoing rapid intensification, John strengthened from a moderate tropical storm into a Category 3 hurricane on September 24. It was at that intensity that John made landfall in Marquelia, Guerrero, later that day. Once inland, John rapidly weakened, dissipating over Mexico later that day. However, the mid-level remnants of John moved back over the ocean, where favorable conditions enabled John to redevelop. On September 27, after again becoming a minimal hurricane, Tropical Storm John made its second landfall, this time near Tizupan, Michoacán. Hours later, it dissipated for a final time over the coastal mountains.

John resulted in strong winds, significant flooding, and numerous mudslides across much of coastal southwestern Mexico. A total of 950 mm (37 in) of rain fell across parts of Guerrero, with similarly extreme rainfall in neighboring Oaxaca and Michoacán. More than 98,000 people lost power in Oaxaca. As of September 28, twenty-nine deaths have been reported in association with John.

U.S. AMBASSADOR TO MEXICO - KEN SALAZAR



Ken Salazar was sworn in as United States Ambassador to Mexico on September 2, 2021

In 2009, President Obama nominated Mr. Salazar to serve as Secretary of Interior where he had a lead role on the Obama-Biden agenda on energy and climate, the nation's conservation agenda including America's Great Outdoors, and Indian Country. Ambassador Salazar has been a lifelong fighter for civil rights and the inclusion of Latinos in the American dream.

In 1998, Mr. Salazar was elected as Colorado Attorney General and became the first Latino ever elected to statewide office in Colorado. He was reelected as Attorney General in 2002. In 2004, Attorney General Salazar was elected to the United States Senate for Colorado becoming the first Latino democrat to be elected to the United States Senate since 1972.

Ambassador Salazar has been admitted to practice law in state and federal courts, including the United States Supreme Court.

Ambassador Salazar and his family have farmed along the banks of the Rio Grande River in New Mexico and Colorado for more than four centuries
